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Preface

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) has carried out a number of all-India household surveys on employment and unemployment since its 9th round (May-September, 1955). All-India surveys on employment and unemployment are being conducted quinquennially on a large sample of households from the 27th round (October 1972 – September 1973). Six quinquennial surveys have so far been conducted by the NSSO in its 27th round, 32nd round (July 1977 – June 1978), 38th round (January – December 1983), 43rd round (July 1987 – June 1988), 50th round (July 1993 – June 1994) and 55th round (July 1999 – June 2000). Apart from these quinquennial surveys, the NSSO collected information on certain key items on employment and unemployment, as a part of the annual series, from a smaller sample of households in each round since 45th round (July 1989 – June 1990) till 59th round (January – December 2003). The data in these rounds was collected through the schedule meant for household consumer expenditure. In the 60th round, a separate schedule was designed for collection of data on employment and unemployment and the same was collected from an independent set of moderately large number of sample households.

The present report features quantitative information on various characteristics pertaining to employment and unemployment and some characteristics associated with them at the national and state levels on the basis of the data collected through the employment and unemployment schedule in the 60th round. This report also presents some quantitative information on vocational training received by persons in the age group 15-29 years. This information on vocational training was collected by NSSO for the first time in its 60th round. The report contains three chapters and three appendices. Chapter One deals with the introduction, Chapter Two with concepts and definitions that have been used in the survey and Chapter Three discusses the main findings of the survey.

The field work of the survey was carried out by the Field Operations Division of NSSO. Data processing and tabulation work was handled by the Data Processing Division of NSSO. While the Survey Design and Research Division of NSSO was responsible for designing the survey and preparing this report, the Co-ordination and Publication Division of NSSO was responsible for the over-all coordination.

I am thankful to the members of the Working Group for the 60th round for their valuable guidance at various phases of the work - from designing of the schedule of enquiry to the preparation of this report. I am also grateful to the members of the Governing Council of NSSO for providing technical guidance at various stages of work.

I hope the report will be useful to the planners, policy-makers and researchers. Comments and suggestions on the report are most welcome.

HIGHLIGHTS

An independent schedule was canvassed for collection of data on employment and unemployment in the 60th round survey of NSS during January to June, 2004. This report is based on the data collected in this survey. The survey was spread over 4755 villages and 2669 urban blocks covering 59159 households and enumerating 204403 persons. Employment and unemployment were measured, in this annual round, with three different approaches, viz., usual status with a reference period of one year, current weekly status with one week reference period and current daily status based on the daily activity pursued during each day of the reference week. Unless otherwise stated, 'all' usual status workers were considered, i.e. workers in terms of both their principal and subsidiary status. Some of the key findings are stated below.

- As per the survey estimates, during January – June 2004, about 72 per cent of the households belonged to rural India and accounted for nearly 75 per cent of total population. The average household size for the rural sector is 5.0, which is higher than the urban average of 4.5.
- About 62 per cent of rural males and 80 per cent of urban males in the country were literate. Among the females, the literacy rate was 43 per cent and 68 per cent in the rural and urban areas, respectively.
- According to the usual principal and subsidiary statuses taken together (called 'all' usual status), nearly 44 per cent of the rural persons - about 7 percentage points higher than that in the urban areas - were in the labour force, which comprise both the work-force (employed) and the unemployed. The corresponding percentages for males were 55 and 56 and for females were 32 and 16 in rural and urban areas respectively.
- About 43 per cent of persons in the rural areas and 35 per cent in the urban were employed as per their usual status. For males, the proportion was 54 per cent in both the rural and urban, and for females, only 32 in the rural and 15 in the urban areas.
- Interestingly, among 'all' usual status male workers in the rural areas, nearly 3 per cent had worked solely in the subsidiary capacity and the corresponding proportion for urban males was 2 per cent. This proportion increased manifold in the case of 'all' female workers. About 28 per cent of them, in the rural areas, had worked in the subsidiary capacity only and the proportion turned out to be 19 per cent for urban 'all' female workers.
- The Worker population ratios (WPRs) according to the daily status were slightly lower than those according to the current weekly status, which, in turn, were slightly lower than those according to the usual status.

- The comparison of WPRs over a short period shows that, compared to the year 2003, the WPRs, according to the principal and subsidiary statuses taken together, did not change during the first half of 2004 in both the rural and urban areas.
- During 2004 (January–June), in rural India and in the usually employed ('all' workers) category, about 57 per cent among males and nearly 62 per cent among females were *self-employed*. The corresponding proportions in urban India were 44 per cent for males and 45 per cent for females. The proportion of *casual labour* was higher among female workers than that among male workers, particularly in the urban areas.
- In the rural areas, about 66 per cent of *usually employed* males and 84 per cent of *usually employed* females were engaged in the agricultural sector. The share of rural employment, in the agricultural sector, was 78 per cent in 1983, 75 per cent in 1987-88, 74 per cent in 1993-94 and 71 per cent in 1999-2000. At those points of time, the proportions of female workers engaged in the agricultural activities were 88, 85, 86 and 85 per cent, respectively.
- In urban India, the 'tertiary' sector (industry division as per NIC-1998: 50 - 99) engaged about 59 per cent of the male workers while 'secondary' sector (industry division as per NIC-1998: 10 - 45) accounted for about 35 per cent of the usually employed males. For females, the corresponding proportions were lower with 53 and 31 per cent.
- In rural India, on an average, a male casual labourer earned Rs. 56.53 in a day whereas; a female casual labourer earned Rs. 36.15 in a day – showing a difference of about Rs. 20.
- In urban India, the wage difference between males and females was even more prominent. A male casual labourer in the urban areas earned Rs. 75.51 in a day and a female, Rs. 44.28 in a day.
- The share of the usually unemployed in the population was negligible – 0.7 per cent and 1.7 per cent in the rural and urban areas, respectively.
- The unemployment rate in the urban areas is higher than that in the rural areas by the usual status and cws approach. Secondly, the rates for females are higher than the rates for males in the urban areas.
- The proportion of usually employed who reported themselves as not employed during the week preceding the date of survey was higher for females than for males. For females, it was 23 per cent in the rural and 10 per cent in the urban areas.

- The proportion of person-days of the usually employed who reported as employed during the days of the week preceding the date of survey was much lower for females – 60 per cent in rural India and 78 per cent in urban India – than for males, for whom the corresponding percentages were 87 and 93.
- Among the unemployed of age 15-59 years (i.e., those who were unemployed on all the seven days preceding the date of survey), the proportion of new entrants in the labour market was higher in the urban areas (55 per cent for males and 67 per cent for females) than that in the rural areas (38 per cent for males and 36 per cent for females). The rate was the highest among the educated and also, among the youths.
- Among persons of age 15-29 years and educational level ‘middle and above but below graduate’, nearly 3 per cent in the rural areas and 6 per cent in the urban areas reported to have received formal vocational training.
- The proportion of persons of age 15-29 years who received formal vocational training increased with the level of general education.
- The proportion of those who received formal vocational training among the persons of age 15-29 years with educational level ‘middle school and above but below graduate’ was found to be highest among the unemployed and that too, among the females.

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Chapter One

Introduction

1.1 The report in perspective

1.1.1 An all-India survey on the situation of employment and unemployment in India during the period January to June, 2004 was carried out as part of the annual series in the 60th round of the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO). In this survey, a nation-wide enquiry was conducted in a moderately large sample of households to provide estimates on various characteristics pertaining to employment and unemployment in India and some characteristics associated with them at the national and state levels. Information on various facets of employment and unemployment in India were collected through a schedule of enquiry (Schedule 10). These apart, information on vocational training received by persons in the age group 15-29 were collected for the first time in NSS surveys. Based on the data collected during the survey period, estimates pertaining to employment-unemployment in India along with various characteristics associated with these have been presented in this report.

1.2 Background

1.2.1 *Past Surveys:* To assess the volume and structure of employment and unemployment, starting with the 9th round (May-September, 1955), NSSO conducted a number of surveys on employment and unemployment. To give a firm conceptual framework for conducting such surveys, the Planning Commission, in the year 1970, set up an 'Expert Committee on Unemployment Estimates', (popularly known as the Dantwala Committee), which reviewed these surveys and the indicators generated from such surveys. Based on concepts and definitions recommended by this Committee, the first quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment was conducted in the 27th round of NSS. After the 27th round, quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment situation in India have been carried out by the NSSO, during the 32nd round (July 1977 - June 1978), 38th round (January 1983 - December 1983), 43rd round (July 1987 - June 1988), 50th round (July 1993 - June 1994) and 55th round (July 1999 - June 2000), in which concepts, definitions and procedures were based primarily on the recommendations of the Dantwala Committee. The results of these surveys have been brought out in the form of NSS reports. The seventh quinquennial survey on employment and unemployment situation in India have been carried out by NSSO in its 61st round (July 2004 - June 2005).

1.2.2 *Other surveys on employment-unemployment:* Apart from these quinquennial surveys on employment and unemployment, NSSO has been regularly collecting information on certain key items on employment and unemployment, as a part of annual series, from a smaller sample of households in each round since its 45th round (July 1989 - June 1990) through the schedule on Household Consumer Expenditure (Schedule 1.0). The objective of data collected in the annual series was, so far, measuring employment and unemployment indicators in terms of the usual and current weekly statuses only, and study of these indicators in respect of category of employment, industrial distribution of the usually employed, etc. These procedures continued till the 59th round of NSS.

1.2.3 *The present survey*: In the present survey, there was a significant change in respect of the procedure of data collection and content of information as compared to the earlier annual rounds. Planning Commission, this time, submitted their additional requirement of measuring employment and unemployment in terms of current daily status approach. They also stressed the requirement of collecting information in respect of formal vocational training received by the youth to assess its volume and structure for future manpower planning, besides collecting information from persons who were unemployed on all 7 days preceding the date of survey on their employment, if any, in the past, status and industry of work, reason for quitting the job, etc. that were generally collected in the quinquennial rounds. These requirements of Planning Commission necessitated the designing of a separate schedule (Schedule 10) for collection of information on employment and unemployment situation in order to release the burden of the schedule meant for gathering information on household consumer expenditure. Therefore, the schedule on employment and unemployment was canvassed in a separate set of sample households. The facsimile of the Schedule 10 designed for the 60th round of NSSO is given in Appendix C.

1.3 Scope of the survey

1.3.1 *Items of enquiry*: As in the quinquennial round surveys, in the present survey too, NSSO collected data on some characteristics, based on which, estimates of employment and unemployment, measured in terms of three basic approaches, viz., usual status, current weekly status and current daily status can be obtained. The reference period for these approaches differ - it being 365 days preceding the date of survey for 'usual status', 7 days preceding the date of survey for 'current weekly status' and each day of the 7 days preceding the date of survey for 'current daily status'.

1.3.2 Data were collected on the activity status of all persons, i.e. for workers, for those seeking or available for work and also for those remaining out of labour force. A worker could be self-employed or enjoy regular salaries/wages or be employed on casual wage basis. Data on this aspect, along with the industry of work of the worker and his/her occupation, were collected during this survey. In order to reveal the multi-dimensional features of the employment-unemployment situation in India, information on several correlates pertaining to it were also gathered. In addition, probing questions were put to the persons who were found unemployed on all the seven days preceding the date of survey in order to understand the numerical magnitude of new entrants into the job market and reason for becoming unemployed for those who were ever employed. Information was also collected, for the first time, from the youth of age 15-29 years with educational qualification middle school and above but below graduate whether they had acquired any formal vocational training or not. Information on vocational training was also collected from the graduate youths having vocational training. The collection of these information was to some extent exploratory in nature and the information pertained to duration of training, field of training, institution of training, usefulness of the training, etc.

1.3.3 All the estimates presented in this report are based on Central sample data only. This report deals, in some details, with the employment-unemployment estimates measured in terms of the three basic approaches of usual status, current weekly status and current daily status and their patterns along with their correlates. It also covers some aspects of underemployment. The results relating to the participation in vocational training form an important part of the report.

The report gives the results generated at all-India level and some important results for different States/Union Territories. As the sample sizes for the smaller States and Union Territories may not be adequate enough for getting reliable estimate separately for each of them, instead of giving results for each of the Union Territories and North-eastern states separately, results have been presented in the report for group of Union Territories and group of North-eastern states.

1.3.4 Geographical Coverage: The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union excepting (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) 768 interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of the bus route and (iii) villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year. A few other areas of Jammu & Kashmir were also excluded from the survey coverage owing to unfavourable field conditions.

1.4 The survey outline

1.4.1. Method of data collection: The survey used the interview method for data collection from a sample of randomly selected households. The sample design on the basis of which the selection of households was made is stated in brief in the following sub-section.

1.4.2 Period of survey and work programme: The fieldwork of 60th round of NSSO started from 1st January, 2004 and continued till 30th June, 2004. As usual, the survey period of this round was divided into two sub-rounds, each with a duration of three months, the 1st sub-round period ranging from January to March, 2004 and the 2nd sub-round period from April to June, 2004. An equal number of sample FSU's was allotted for survey in each of these two sub-rounds.

1.5 Sampling design

1.5.1 An outline of the sampling design: The sampling design adopted for the survey was essentially a stratified multi-stage one for both rural and urban areas. The first stage units (FSUs) were villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) for rural areas and NSS Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks for urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USUs) were households. The procedure for selection of fsus/usus is given in detail in Appendix B of this report. Large FSUs were subdivided into hamlet-groups (rural)/sub-blocks (urban). Details of the formation of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks and procedure of selection of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks and then of households are also given in Appendix B.

1.5.2 Sampling Frame for FSUs: The list of villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) as per 1991 Census and latest lists of UFS blocks of NSSO were respectively used for selection of rural and urban sample FSUs. For selection of sample villages from the State of Jammu & Kashmir, the list of villages as per 1981 Census was used as the sampling frame. However, interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms. of the bus route and inaccessible villages of Andaman & Nicobar Islands were left out of the survey coverage of NSS 60th round.

1.5.3 *Sample Size – first stage units*: A total number of 7,612 FSUs (4,908 villages and 2,704 urban blocks) was selected for survey in the Central sample at the all-India level in the 60th round for canvassing Schedule 10. Sample size for the whole round for each State/UT x sector (i.e. rural/urban) was allocated equally among the 2 sub-rounds. Sample FSUs for each sub-round were selected afresh in the form of 2 independent sub-samples. Out of these 7612 FSUs allotted for survey, 7424 FSUs could be surveyed - 4755 in rural and 2669 in urban. Note that in the 60th round, a sample of 8,260 FSUs (5,164 villages and 3,096 urban blocks) was also selected for survey by the state agencies (State sample) at the all-India level.

1.5.4. *Sample size – second stage units*: For Schedule 10, a sample of 8 households was selected and surveyed from each selected village and urban block. In the Central sample, 59159 households were actually surveyed – 37883 in rural areas and 21276 in urban areas. As regards the actual number of persons surveyed, it was 204403 in the rural sector and 99425 in the urban sector.

1.5.5 *Sub-rounds*: Field work for the 60th round survey was done during the period 1.1.04 to 30.6.04. To maintain the uniform spread of the sample during the entire period of survey, this period of six months was divided into two sub-rounds of three months duration each viz., sub-round 1: January – March 2004 and sub-round 2: April – June 2004. In each of these sub-rounds, in general, equal number of sample villages/ blocks were allotted for survey.

1.6 Contents of the Report

1.6.1 As stated earlier, this report deals with various estimates on employment and unemployment along with their correlates as obtained from data collected on relevant items for the entire round. Consequently, all discussions in this report are limited to only such items/concepts, based on which estimates have been generated. A detailed explanation of these is given in the next chapter entitled ‘Concepts and Definitions’.

1.6.2 This report contains three chapters, including the present introductory chapter, and three appendices. Chapter Two states in detail the concepts and definitions of terms used in the survey in connection with the various items covered in this report. Chapter Three discusses the main findings of the survey. While the detailed tables based on which this report is brought out are presented in the Appendix A, the sample design and the estimation procedure is given in Appendix B. The facsimile of the schedule is given in Appendix C.

Chapter Two

Concepts, Definitions and Procedures

2.0 The concepts and definitions of some important terms used in the survey are explained in the following paragraphs. They are relevant to this report for understanding various estimates on employment-unemployment.

2.1 **Household:** A group of persons who normally lived together and took food from a common kitchen constituted a household. The adverb “normally” means that temporary visitors were excluded but temporary stay-aways were included. Thus a son/daughter residing in a hostel for studies was excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident employee or a resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) was included in the employer’s/host’s household. ‘Living together’ was given more importance than ‘sharing food from a common kitchen’ in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria were in conflict. However, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to space shortage, the household formed by such a person’s family members was taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a hotel, mess, boarding-lodging house, hostel, etc., was considered to be a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) was considered as one household only. The same principle was applicable for the residential staff of such establishments.

2.2 **Economic activity:** Any activity resulting in production of goods and services that add value to national product was considered as an economic activity. Such activities included (i) production of all goods and services for market (market activities), i.e. production for pay or profit, and, (ii) the production of primary commodities for own consumption and own account production of fixed assets, among the non-market activities.

2.2.1 The entire spectrum of human activity falls into two categories—economic and non-economic activities. The economic activities have two parts - market activities and non-market activities. Market activities are those that involve remuneration to those who perform it, i.e., activity performed for pay or profit. These are essentially production of goods and services for the market including those of government services, etc. Non-market activities are the production for own consumption of primary products including own account processing of primary products and own account production of fixed assets.

2.2.2 The full spectrum of economic activities as defined in the UN system of National Accounts (1993) was not covered in the definition adopted for the NSS 60th round survey of Employment and Unemployment. For example, the former included activities like own account processing of primary products among other things. In the NSS, activities relating to the production of primary goods for own consumption, was restricted to the agriculture sector only and did not include the activities in mining and quarrying sector. The coverage of economic activities has, however, remained the same since the 50th round. Earlier to that, own account production of fixed assets was not considered as economic activity.

The term 'economic activity' in the present survey, therefore, included:

(i) all the market activities performed for pay or profit which result in production of goods and services for exchange.

(ii) of the non-market activities,

(a) all the activities relating to the agricultural sector (Industry Divisions 01 to 05 of NIC 1998) which result in production (including gathering of uncultivated crops, forestry, collection of firewood, hunting, fishing etc.) of agricultural produce for own consumption

and

(b) the activities relating to the own-account production of fixed assets. Own account production of fixed assets include construction of own houses, roads, wells etc., and of machinery, tools etc., for household enterprise and also construction of any private or community facilities free of charge. A person may be engaged in own account construction either in the capacity of a labourer or a supervisor.

As per the practice followed in earlier rounds, certain activities like prostitution, begging, smuggling etc., which though fetched earnings, were not considered as economic activities.

2.3 Activity status: It is the activity situation in which a person was found during a reference period with regard to the person's participation in economic and non-economic activities. According to this, a person could be in one or a combination of the following three broad activity statuses during a reference period:

(i) working or being engaged in economic activity (work) as defined above,

(ii) being not engaged in economic activity (work) but either making tangible efforts to seek 'work' or being available for 'work' if the 'work' is available, and

(iii) being not engaged in any economic activity (work) and also not available for 'work'.

Broad activity statuses mentioned in (i) and (ii) above are associated with 'being in labour force' and the last with 'not being in the labour force'. Within the labour force, broad activity status (i) and (ii) were associated with 'employment' and 'unemployment', respectively.

2.3.1 Categories of activity status: Identification of each individual into a unique situation could pose a problem when more than one of the three broad activity statuses listed above were concurrently obtained for a person. In such an eventuality, the identification uniquely under any one of the three broad activity statuses was done by adopting *either the major time or priority criterion* (see para 2.10 below). The former was used for classification of persons according to the 'usual activity status' approach and the latter for classification of persons according to the 'current activity status' approach. Each of the three broad activity statuses was further sub-divided into several detailed activity categories. If a person categorised as engaged in economic activity by adopting one of the two criteria mentioned above was found to be pursuing more than one economic activity during the reference period, the appropriate detailed activity status code related to that activity in which relatively more time had been spent. A similar procedure was adopted for assigning detailed activity code for persons categorised as engaged in non-economic activity and pursuing more than one non-economic activity. The detailed activity categories under each of the three broad activity statuses used

in the survey (along with the codes assigned to them as indicated in brackets) are stated below:

(i) situation of working or being engaged in economic activities (employed):

- (a) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as own account worker (11);
- (b) worked in household enterprise (self-employed) as employer (12);
- (c) worked as helper in household enterprises (unpaid family worker) (21);
- (d) worked as regular salaried/wage employee (31);
- (e) worked as casual wage labour (i) in public works (41), (ii) in other types of work (51);
- (f) had work in household enterprise but did not work due to: (i) sickness (61), (ii) other reasons (62); and
- (g) had regular salaried/wage employment but did not work due to: (i) sickness (71), (ii) other reasons (72);

(ii) situation of being not engaged in work but seeking or available for work (unemployed):

- (a) sought work (81) and
- (b) did not seek but was available for work (82)

(iii) situation of being not available for work (not in labour force):

- (a) attended educational institutions (91);
- (b) attended domestic duties only (92);
- (c) attended domestic duties and was also engaged in free collection of goods (vegetables, roots, firewood, cattle-feed, etc.) sewing, tailoring, weaving, etc. for household use (93);
- (d) rentiers, pensioners, remittance recipients, etc. (94);
- (e) not able to work due to disability (95);
- (f) beggars, prostitutes (96);
- (g) others (97) and
- (h) did not work due to sickness (for casual workers only) (98).

2.4 Workers (or employed): Persons who were engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, abstained from work for reason of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence from work, constituted workers. Unpaid helpers who assisted in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities were also considered as workers. All the workers were assigned one of the detailed activity statuses under the broad activity category 'working' or 'being engaged in economic activity' (or employed).

2.5 Seeking or available for work (or unemployed): Persons, who owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, were considered as those who were 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed).

2.6 Labour force: Persons, who, were either 'working' (or employed) or 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed) constituted the labour force. Persons who were neither 'working'

nor 'seeking or available for work' for various reasons during the reference period were considered as 'out of labour force'. The persons under this latter category are students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, infirm or disabled persons, too young or too old persons, prostitutes, smugglers, etc. and casual labourers not working due to sickness.

2.7 Self-employed: Persons who operated their own farm or non-farm enterprises or were engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners were deemed to be self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of the self-employed is that they have *autonomy* (i.e., how, where and when to produce) and *economic independence* (i.e., market, scale of operation and money) for carrying out their operation. The fee or remuneration received by them comprised two parts – a return for their labour contribution and profit of the enterprise. In other words, their remuneration was determined wholly or mainly by sales or profits of the goods or services which were produced.

2.7.1 Categories of self-employed persons: Self-employed persons were categorised as follows:

- (i) **own-account workers:** those self-employed persons who operated their enterprises on their own account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, ran their enterprise without hiring any labour. They could, however, have had unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise;
- (ii) **employers:** those self-employed persons who worked on their own account or with one or a few partners and, who, by and large, ran their enterprise by hiring labour; and
- (iii) **helpers in household enterprise:** those self-employed persons (mostly family members) who were engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and did not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work performed. They did not run the household enterprise on their own but assisted the related person living in the same household in running the household enterprise.

2.8 Regular salaried/wage employee: These were persons who worked in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received salary or wages on a regular basis (i.e. not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract). This category included not only persons getting time wage but also persons receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full time and part-time.

2.9 Casual wage labour: A person who was casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, received wages according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract, was a casual wage labour.

2.10 Different approaches followed to determine activity status: The persons surveyed were classified into various activity categories on the basis of the activities pursued by them during certain specified reference periods. There were three reference periods for this survey. These are: (i) one year (ii) one week and (iii) each day of the reference week. Based on these three periods, three different measures of activity status are arrived at. These are termed respectively as usual status, current weekly status and the current daily status. The procedure adopted to arrive at these three measures is given below.

2.10.1 Usual activity status: The usual activity status relates to the activity status of a person during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The activity status on which a person spent relatively longer time (i.e. major time criterion) during the 365 days preceding the date of survey is considered as the *principal usual activity status* of the person. To decide the principal usual activity of a person, he/she was first categorised as belonging to the labour force or not during the reference period *on the basis of major time criterion*. Persons thus adjudged as not belonging to the labour force were assigned the broad activity status 'neither working nor available for work'. For persons belonging to the labour force, the broad activity status of either 'working' or 'not working but seeking and/or available for work' was ascertained based on the same criterion viz. relatively longer time spent in accordance with either of the two broad statuses within the labour force during the 365 days preceding the date of survey. Within the broad activity status so determined, the detailed activity status of a person pursuing more than one such activity was determined once again on the basis of the relatively longer time spent on such activities. In terms of activity codes (stated earlier in para 1.3.1), codes 11-51 were applicable for persons classified as workers, while code 81 was assigned to people either seeking or available for work (unemployed persons) and codes 91-97 for those who were out of labour force.

2.10.2 Subsidiary economic activity status: A person whose principal usual status was determined on the basis of the major time criterion could have pursued some economic activity *for a relatively shorter time* (minor time) during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The status in which such economic activity was pursued was the subsidiary economic activity status of that person. Thus, activity status codes 11-51 only were applicable for persons reporting some subsidiary economic activity. It may be noted that engagement in work in subsidiary capacity could arise out of the following two situations, viz.

- (i) a person could be engaged for a relatively longer period during the last 365 days in one economic/non-economic activity and for a relatively shorter period in another economic activity, and
- (ii) a person could be pursuing one economic activity/ non-economic activity almost throughout the year in the principal usual activity status and simultaneously pursue another economic activity for a relatively shorter period in a subsidiary capacity.

2.10.3 Current weekly activity status: The current weekly activity status of a person is the activity status obtaining for a person during a reference period of 7 days preceding the date of survey. It is decided *on the basis of a certain priority cum major time criterion*.

2.10.3.1 According to the *priority criterion*, the status of 'working' gets priority over the status of 'not working but seeking or available for work' which, in turn, gets priority over the status of 'neither working nor available for work'. A person was considered working (or employed) if he/she, while pursuing any economic activity, had worked for at least one hour on at least one day during the 7 days preceding the date of survey. A person was considered 'seeking or available for work (or unemployed)' if, during the reference week, no economic activity was pursued by the person but he/she made efforts to get work or had been available for work any time during the reference week though not actively seeking work in the belief that no work was available. A person who had neither worked nor was available for work any

time during the reference week was considered as engaged in non-economic activities (or not in labour force).

2.10.3.2 After deciding the *broad current weekly activity status* of a person on the *basis of 'priority' criterion*, the *detailed current activity status* was then decided *on the basis of 'major time' criterion if that person pursued multiple economic activities*. The current weekly activity status of a person could be any one of the detailed activity status (ref. para 1.3.1) and could have codes 11 to 98. Of these codes, 11 to 72 pertained to workers, 81 to 82 for unemployed and 91 to 98 for persons out of labour force. It may be noted that these are the same as the usual status codes (stated in para 1.10.1 before) except that codes 61, 62, 71, 72, 82 and 98 are not applicable for usual status and code 81 for usual status is used to indicate both the situations of seeking and being available for work.

2.10.4 ***Current daily activity status:*** The activity pattern of the population, particularly in the unorganised sector, is such that during a week, and sometimes, even during a day, a person could pursue more than one activity. Moreover, many people could even undertake both economic and non-economic activities on the same day of a reference week. The current daily activity status for a person was determined on the basis of his/her activity status on each day of the reference week *using a priority-cum-major time criterion* (day to day labour time disposition). Time disposition was recorded for every member of a sample household. This involved recording of different activities pursued by the members along with the time intensity in quantitative terms for each day of the reference week. The different activities were identified and recorded in terms of 'activity status' and 'industry' codes for persons in urban areas and 'activity status', 'industry' and 'operation' codes for persons in rural areas. The terms 'industry' and 'operation' are explained later. The following points were considered for assigning the time intensity and determining the current daily status of a person:

- i) Each day of the reference week was looked upon as comprising either two 'half days' or a 'full' day for assigning the activity status.
- ii) A person was considered 'working' (employed) for the entire day if he/she had worked for 4 hours or more during the day.
- iii) If a person was engaged in more than one of the economic activities for 4 hours or more on a day, he/she was assigned two out of the various economic activities on which he/she devoted relatively longer time on the reference day (for each of those two activities, the intensity was 0.5).
- iv) If the person had worked for 1 hour or more but less than 4 hours he/she was considered 'working' (employed) for half-day and 'seeking or available for work' (unemployed) or 'neither seeking nor available for work' (not in labour force) for the other half of the day depending on whether he was seeking/available for work or not.
- v) If a person was not engaged in any 'work' even for 1 hour on a day but was seeking/available for work even for 4 hours or more, he was considered 'unemployed' for the entire day. But if he was 'seeking/available for work' for more than 1 hour and less than 4 hours only, he was considered 'unemployed' for half day and 'not in labour force' for the other half of the day.
- vi) A person who neither had any 'work' to do nor was available for 'work' even for half a day was considered 'not in labour force' for the entire day and was assigned one or two of the detailed non-economic activity statuses depending upon the activities pursued during the reference day.

The description (and codes used) of current daily activity statuses are the same as those of current weekly activity status.

2.11 Industry-occupation: The description of the industry-occupation was relevant to the type of economic activity pursued by the person. NIC-1998 was followed for classifying industries and NCO-1968 was followed for classifying occupations. In case two or more industry-occupation combinations corresponding to the status code were reported by a person, the principal industry-occupation was taken as the one in which *relatively more time* was spent during the reference period by the person. It may be noted that under Division 95 of NIC 1998, on “Private households with employed persons”, six additional codes have been introduced for recording 5 digit entries for industry codes in the survey viz., housemaid /servant (95001), cook (95002), gardener (95003), gatekeeper/chowkidar/watchman (95004), governess/baby-sitter (95005) and ‘others’ (95009).

2.12 Operation: This was the type of work performed by a person during a reference period. It could be manual or non-manual and could pertain to activities in agricultural or non-agricultural sector. Operation was combined with activity status and industry corresponding to the work performed. Information regarding the type of operation was collected *only for rural areas* and related to *current status only*. The different types of operations came under four categories. Ploughing, sowing, transplanting, weeding, harvesting and other cultivation activities fell under the category *manual work in cultivation*. Against the category *manual work in other agricultural activities* were the following types: forestry, plantation, animal husbandry, fisheries and other agricultural activities. *Manual work in non-agricultural activities* constituted the third category. The last category viz. *non-manual work* comprised two broad types – (i) in ‘cultivation’ and (ii) in ‘other than cultivation’. It may be noted that for ‘regular salaried/wage employees’ on leave or on holiday, the ‘operation’ related to their respective function in the work or job from which he/she was temporarily off. Similarly, for persons categorised as ‘self-employed’ but not working on a particular day in spite of having work on that day, the operation related to the work that he/she would have done if he/she had not enjoyed leisure on that day.

2.13 Cultivation: All activities relating to production of crops and related ancillary activities are considered as cultivation. Growing of trees, plants or crops as plantation or orchards (such as rubber, cashew, coconut, pepper, coffee, tea etc.) are not considered as cultivation activities for the purpose of this survey. In general, the activities covered under NIC 1998 sub-classes 01111, 01112, 01113, 01115, 01119, 01121, 01122 and 01135 (excepting plantation of pepper and cardamom) are to be considered as cultivation (equivalent to the activities under industry Groups 000 to 008 of NIC 1987).

2.14 Manual work: A job essentially involving physical labour was considered as manual work. However, jobs essentially involving physical labour but also requiring a certain level of general, professional, scientific or technical education were not termed as ‘manual work’. On the other hand, jobs not involving much of physical labour and at the same time not requiring much educational (general, scientific, technical or otherwise) background were treated as ‘manual work’. Thus, engineers, doctors, dentists, midwives, etc., were not considered manual workers even though their jobs involved some amount of physical labour. But, peons, chowkidars, watchman, etc. were considered manual workers even though their work might not involve much physical labour. Manual work was defined as work pursued in one or more

of the following occupational groups of the National Classification of Occupations (NCO 1968):

Division 5: Service workers:

Group 52: cooks, waiters, bartenders and related workers (domestic and institutional).

Group 53: maid and other housekeeping service workers (not elsewhere classified).

Group 54: building caretakers, sweepers, cleaners and related workers.

Group 55: Launderers, dry cleaners and pressers.

Group 56: hair dressers, barbers, beauticians and related workers.

Family 570: fire fighters

Family 574: watchmen, gate-keepers

Family 579: protective service workers not elsewhere classified.

Division 6: Farmers, Fishermen, Hunters, Loggers and related workers :-

Group 63: agricultural labourers

Group 64: plantation labourers and related workers

Group 65: other farm workers

Group 66: forestry workers

Group 67: hunters and related workers

Group 68: fishermen and related workers.

Division 7-8-9: Production and related workers, transport equipment operators and labourers:

All groups excluding group 85 (electrical fitters and related workers) and group 86 (broadcasting station and sound equipment operators and cinema projectionists).

2.15 Earnings: Information on wage and salary earnings was collected separately for each of the wage/salaried work recorded for a person in a day. Here, earnings refers to the wage/salary income (and not total earnings taking into consideration of all other activities done) received/receivable for the wage/salaried work done during the reference week by a wage/salaried employee and casual labourer. The wage/ salary received or receivable may be in cash or kind or partly in cash and partly in kind. While recording the earnings following conventions were followed.

- i) The wages in kind were evaluated at the current retail price.
- ii) Bonus and perquisites such as free accommodation, reimbursement of expenditure for medical treatment, free telephones, etc. evaluated at the cost of the employer or at retail prices and duly apportioned for the reference week were also included in earnings.
- iii) Amount receivable as 'over-time' for the additional work done beyond normal working time was also included.

It may be noted that in the survey, at most two activities could be recorded for a person in a day following the procedure given in Para 2.10.4. It is possible that a person might have carried out two or more wage/salaried activities in a day, but only one activity or two activities at the most, depending upon the time spent on those activities, was recorded. In that case, the wage/salary income only from that activity(s) was collected and recorded separately, and not the total income of the person from all the activities done for the entire day.

2.16 Vocational Training: A vocational training was broadly defined as a training which prepared an individual for a specific vocation or occupation. The main objective of vocational education and training is to prepare persons, especially the youth, for the world of work and make them employable for a broad range of occupations in various industries and other economic sectors. It aims at imparting training to persons in very specific fields through providing significant 'hands on' experience in acquiring necessary skill, which make them employable or create for them opportunities of self-employment.

2.16.1 Formal Vocational Training: For the purpose of this survey, only formal vocational training was considered. Formal vocational training takes place in education and training institutions, which follow a structured training programme, leading to recognised certificates, diplomas or degrees. For the purpose of our survey, the following characteristics were considered for recognizing training programmes as formal vocational training:

- i) structured training programme towards a particular skill having standard norms and syllabus and curriculum;
- ii) more emphasis on skill development rather than building knowledge;
- iii) certificate/diploma/degree received should have a recognition by State/Central Government, Public Sector and other reputed concerns.

By point (i) it was meant that:

- (a) the course should have definite title with prescribed syllabus and curriculum with specified duration of the training;
- (b) it should have some entry level eligibility in terms of education, age.

In point (iii), the term 'reputed concern' meant reputed business concern as well as NGOs.

2.16.2 Field of vocational training: Conventionally, vocational education and training has been oriented towards a number of engineering and technical trades. Though they continue to form the core of vocational education, its scope was considerably widened to include many

non-engineering trades also. In the 60th round survey, the various fields for formal vocational training considered were:

mechanical engineering trades, electrical and electronic engineering trades, computer trades, civil engineering and building construction related works, chemical engineering trades, leather related work, textile related work, catering, nutrition, hotels and restaurant related work, artisan/ craftsman/ handicraft and cottage based production work, creative arts/ artists, agriculture and crop production related skills and food preservation related work, non-crop based agricultural and other related activities, health and paramedical services related work, office and business related work, driving and motor mechanic work, beautician, hairdressing & related work, work related to tour operators/ travel managers, photography and related work, work related to childcare, nutrition, pre-schools and crèches, journalism, mass communication and media related work, and printing technology related work.

2.16.3 Institution providing vocational training: Some of the major sources from where vocational training can be received are: (a) programmes within the mainstream educational system; (b) technician-level vocational programmes initiated by the Ministry of Labour; (c) programmes offered by government-sponsored training institutions outside the school and university systems; and (d) miscellaneous programmes. In this survey, the sources of formal vocational training i.e. the institutions providing vocational training considered were:

Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs)/Industrial Training Centers (ITCs), Schools offering vocational courses (Secondary, Higher Secondary level), UGC (first degree level), Polytechnics, Community Polytechniques/ Janasiksha Sanstha, National Open School, Hotel Management Institutes, Food craft & Catering Institutes, Small Industries Service Institutes/District Industries Centres/Tool Room Centres, Fashion Technology Institutes, Tailoring, Embroidery and Stitch Craft Institutes, Nursing Institutes, Rehabilitation/ Physiotherapy /Ophthalmic and Dental Institutes, Institutes giving Diploma in Pharmacy, Hospital and Medical Training Institutes, Nursery Teachers' Training Institutes, Institutes offering training for Agricultural Extension, Training provided by Carpet Weaving Centers, Handloom/ Handicraft Design Training Centers/ KVIC, Recognised Motor Driving Schools, Institute for Secretariat Practices, Recognised Beautician Schools, Institutes run by Companies/ Corporations, Institutes for Journalism and Mass Communication, other institutes.

2.17 Procedure for determining household type: On the basis of the sources of the household's income during the last 365 days preceding the date of survey, the household types were assigned. For this purpose, only the household's income from economic activities was considered. The income of servants and paying guests was not taken as the income of the household. For the **rural** areas, household types were as follows:

self-employed in non-agriculture;	agricultural labour;	other labour;
self-employed in agriculture;	others.	

For **urban** areas, the household types were as follows:

self-employed; regular wage/salary earning; casual labour ; others.

2.18 Procedure for determining household industry and occupation: To determine the household principal industry and occupation, the general procedure followed was to list all the occupations pertaining to economic activities pursued by the members of the household excluding those employed by the household and paying guests (who in view of their staying and taking food in the household were considered as its normal members) during the one year period preceding the date of survey, no matter whether such occupations were pursued by the members in their principal or subsidiary (on the basis of earnings) capacity. Out of the occupations listed that one that fetched the maximum earnings to the household during the last 365 days preceding the date of survey was considered as the principal household occupation. If one or more members of the household pursued the household occupation in different industries, the particular industry out of all the different industries corresponding to the principal occupation, which fetched the maximum earnings, was considered as the principal industry of the household.

2.19 Procedure followed for collecting employment and unemployment particulars: In the quinquennial round surveys, particulars of employment and unemployment were collected according to the usual principal status, usual subsidiary status through two separate blocks. A separate block was also used for recording particulars of current weekly status and current daily status of the individual household members where weekly status was derived from the current daily statuses. In the 60th round, employment and unemployment particulars according to the usual principal status and usual subsidiary status were collected through a single block. The current weekly and daily activity particulars were collected through a single separate block in the same manner as that of the quinquennial rounds. Prior to the 60th round, in the annual round surveys, only activity status and industry of work according to usual principal, subsidiary status and current weekly status approach were collected through a few columns of the demographic block of the Consumer Expenditure Schedule (Schedule 1.0) where current weekly status and industry was determined through a direct query.

2.20 Procedure for collecting monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE): In the annual round surveys prior to the 60th round, since employment and unemployment particulars were collected through Schedule 1.0, the MPCE obtained from detailed consumer expenditure schedule were used for studying the employment and unemployment situation by MPCE. Like in the 55th, 60th and the just completed 61st rounds on employment and unemployment, to get a proxy for total expenditure, a worksheet was used for collection of information on household consumer expenditure in Schedule 10. The approximate value of consumer expenditure obtained through the worksheet has been used for studying employment characteristics by different levels of living of the household members. The worksheet contained 36 different components of household consumer expenditure. Depending upon the type of item, either of the two reference periods viz., 30 days and 365 days, was used to record consumption of different groups of items. The items of consumption were classified into four groups and three different approaches viz (i) consumption approach, (ii) expenditure approach and (iii) first-use approach, were followed for defining consumption of items. The different groups were (i) food(*other than 'cooked meals'*), *pan, tobacco & intoxicants and fuel & light*, (ii) *cooked meals, miscellaneous goods and services including education, medical, rent, taxes and cess*, (iii) *clothing and footwear* and (iv) *durable goods*. The procedure followed for defining consumption of the four groups were (i) *consumption approach*, (ii) *expenditure approach*, (iii) *first-use approach* and (iv) *expenditure approach*. The definition of household consumer expenditure and the procedure for evaluating that was the same for both Schedule 10 and Schedule 1.0.

Chapter Three

Summary of Findings

3.0. Introduction

3.0.1 As stated earlier in Chapter One, NSS 60th round was conducted during January-June 2004 (henceforth referred to as 2004). The detailed results obtained from the survey are presented in the appendix of this report. This chapter presents the main findings of the survey and related discussions. The discussions on the findings have been organised into six sections. To study the employment-unemployment situation of a country, it is necessary to look into the socio-economic structure of the households and the demographic pattern of the population of the country during that time. Therefore, certain information on socio-economic condition of sample households and demographic data pertaining to the surveyed individuals were also collected in this survey. In the first section, the main findings relating to these aspects are presented. The second section that highlights the estimates of employment and unemployment indicators classified by various correlates such as sex, age group, monthly per capita expenditure class, educational level, etc. The discussion of unemployment rate by sex, age group, educational level, etc. appears in Section 3 and that for the extent of underemployment in Section 4. Section 5 presents results for those who were unemployed on all the seven days preceding the date of survey. This chapter ends with the estimates of youths who had received formal vocational training and the estimates have been examined in respect of field of training, institute of training, duration of training, etc.

3.0.2 In this chapter, the discussions are centered around the estimates at the all-India level only. However, the corresponding estimates for its constituent States and Union Territories are given at the end of this chapter. A comparison with earlier survey results has also been provided in some cases.

3.0.3 *Use of estimated aggregates:* Compared to the census population or the projections thereof, population estimates from the NSSO surveys are, in general, on the lower side. This difference may arise due to the differences in methods and coverage adopted by the NSSO in comparison with the census operation. However, the ratios obtained from the survey are expected to be robust. This is why the estimates on employment- unemployment are usually presented as ratios. To estimate an absolute number in any category, it is advisable to apply the survey estimates of ratios to the census population or projections thereof, for that category. The estimates of aggregates given in the margin of the detailed tables in the appendix may help to combine the ratios but may not be used for generating estimates of absolute numbers for a characteristic. It may also be noted that as the tables are generally presented as per thousand distribution, the figures are rounded off. Thus, while using the ratios from the survey results, it is to be noted that the accuracy of these derived aggregates will be limited to the number of significant digits available in the ratio or percentage estimates presented in the report. The estimated aggregates, wherever possible, can be used to get ratios with more significant digits.

3.0.4 The estimates of some important indicators of employment and unemployment, as mentioned earlier, have been presented for all the States and Union Territories (UTs) together with group of UTs. and North-eastern states. While using the estimates for the smaller states and UTs. or for some category, it may be kept in mind that the sample sizes for them may not

be adequate enough for getting separate estimates for each of them which are sufficiently reliable – at least for measuring change or inter-State comparisons.

3.1 Estimates of Households and Population

3.1.1 As per the survey estimates, during January – June 2004, about 956 million people resided in 199 million households in India. About 72 per cent of the households belonged to rural India and accounted for nearly 75 per cent of total population.

3.1.1.1 Statement 1 gives the average household size and sex ratio (number of females per 1000 males) obtained from this round and from the last five quinquennial rounds, those conducted during 1977-78 to 1999-2000. It is seen from this Statement that, during January – June 2004, the sex ratio was 959 in rural and 913 in urban areas. The average household size for the rural sector is 5.0, which is higher than the urban average of 4.4.

3.1.1.2 *Change over the years*: It is seen from the Statement that the sex-ratio remained stable

between the periods 1999-2000 and 2004 after experiencing an increase between the periods 1993-94 and 1999-2000 – more so in rural areas than in urban areas. There is a reversal of the trend seen between 1983 and 1993-94 in rural areas, during which period, the ratio declined gradually. The sex ratio, in the urban, seems to have improved gradually since 1977-78 until 1987-88, and then returned to the origin marked at 905 females per 1000 males and passed through 915 in 1999-

2000 and 913 in 2004. As regards the average household size, the estimate was leveled at 5.0 and 4.4 during 2004 in the rural and urban areas, respectively. In both the rural and urban areas, household size appears to have declined over the years since 1977-78, slightly in rural areas and markedly in urban.

3.1.2 Household Type

3.1.2.1 The nature and type of work from which a household derives its major part of income is an important indicator of the activity pattern of its members. Every sample household was, therefore, categorised into *household type*, depending on the economic activity of the members of the household during the 365 days preceding the date of survey from which major part of income of the household was generated. The distribution of households and the corresponding population by *household type* for all-India is given in Statement 2.

3.1.2.2 Statement 2 reveals that during January-June, 2004, members of about 51 per cent of the rural households took recourse to *self-employment*. They constituted about 55 per cent of the rural population. Another 35 per cent of the rural population belonged to *rural labour* households. Such households constituted 37 per cent of all rural households.

Among urban households, *regular employment* was the mainstay of 41 per cent of households with an almost equal share (39 per cent) of urban population. Nearly 37 per cent of the urban households had income mainly from *self-employment*.

3.1.3 Monthly Per Capita Expenditure (MPCE)

3.1.3.1 Household income, or for that matter 'level of living', is closely related to 'employment' of the household members. Thus, the distribution of households and population by income level is a useful background information for a correlative study on 'employment' or 'unemployment'. As it is difficult to collect reliable income data, the NSSO collects data on consumption expenditure in its surveys. In the present survey on employment-unemployment, data on consumption expenditure was collected through a separate work-sheet which was integrated with the employment-unemployment schedule. Based on the data, monthly per capita expenditure was worked out for each sample household, which is expected to serve as a reasonable proxy for per capita income. The distributions of households and the corresponding population by MPCE class for all-India are presented in Statement 3.

3.1.3.2 In urban India, about 34 per cent of the households – which accounted for nearly 42 per cent of the

population - spent less than Rs.665 per month per person. On the other hand, in rural India, about 40 per cent of the households – which accounted for 46 per cent of the population - could spend up to Rs.420. The proportion of households spending Rs.775 or more per capita was as low as 15 per cent in rural India; it was a little above 57 per cent in urban India.

3.1.4 Age Distribution of Population

3.1.4.1 Age and sex are two important demographic characteristics. The distribution of population by age-group and sex as background information could improve the understanding of the results on employment-unemployment. In Statement 4, the distribution of rural and urban population by 5-year age-groups is presented for males and females separately.

3.1.4.2 *Age distribution:* The rural-urban difference in the age-distribution of population is clearly evident from Statement 4. About 36 per cent of the rural population were children belonging to the age-group 0-14 years compared to nearly 30 per cent in the urban areas. The gender differential in this respect appears to be significant in the rural

sector, but not in urban areas. The youth of age 15-29 years comprised 26 per cent of population in the rural areas and 29 per cent in the urban areas. The percentage of elderly women, that is, women of age 60 years and above, tends to be more than that of the elderly men, particularly in urban areas.

3.1.5 Educational Level of Population

3.1.5.1 Literacy, together with educational attainment, determines the quality of population and is highly related to one's employment prospects. For the purposes of this survey, a person who could read and write a simple message in any language with understanding was considered a *literate*. *Literates* were further classified according to their levels of educational attainment. Thus, it is important to study the distribution of population by educational attainment (level) before a comprehensive discussion is attempted on employment-unemployment in the subsequent sections of this chapter. In Statement 5, the distribution of males and females by general educational level as estimated from the present survey on employment and unemployment are presented separately for rural and urban India. The distribution of persons of age 15 years and above by education level (given in parenthesis) is also summarized in this Statement for each sex and rural-urban residence at the all-India level.

3.1.5.2 About 62 per cent of rural males and 80 per cent of urban males in the country were

literate. Among the females, the literacy rate was 43 per cent and 68 per cent in the rural and urban areas, respectively. The proportion of *educated* persons (i.e. educational level *secondary and above*) is found to be highest among the urban males – being about 32 per cent – followed by urban females (24 per cent) and rural males (13 per cent). In the ‘literate but up to primary’ category, the proportion was highest among the rural males – the proportion being about 34 per cent. In this category, the second in the rung was the urban males with nearly 30

percentage points. The ordering of the four categories of population of age 15 years and above with respect to general educational level was broadly the same as that for the general population.

3.2 Labour Force and Employed

3.2.1 Labour-force, or in others words, the ‘economically active’ population, refers to the population which supplies or seeks to supply labour for production and, therefore, includes both ‘employed’ and ‘unemployed’ persons, and the labour-force participation rate (LFPR) is defined as the number of persons in the labour-force per 1000 persons. Similarly, the number of persons/person-days employed per thousand persons/person-days is referred to as work-force participation rates (WFPR) or worker-population ratio (WPR). For measuring LFPR or WPR, all the three approaches, viz. usual status, current weekly status and current daily status, were adopted for collection of data in the survey.

3.2.1.1 The survey has, therefore, generated three different estimates of LFPR and WPR based on the three approaches used in classification of the activity statuses of the person surveyed. These are:

- number of persons in the labour-force or employed or unemployed according to usual principal status (ps) and number of persons in the labour-force or employed or unemployed according to both the principal and subsidiary statuses (ps & ss),
- number of persons in the labour-force or employed or unemployed on an average in a week, and
- number of persons-days in the labour-force or employed or unemployed per day on an average during the reference period of 7 days preceding the date of survey.

3.2.1.2 In this section, the estimate of the labour-force, particularly the work force (or employed) and their structure are discussed. In order to study the trend, earlier survey estimates, in some cases, are provided.

3.2.2 Labour-force Participation Rate (LFPR)

Statement 6: WPR (number of persons/ person-days worked per 1000 persons/ person-days), PU (number of persons unemployed/ person-days unemployed per 1000 persons/ person-days) and LFPR (number of persons/ person-days in the labour force per 1000 persons /person-days) according to usual status (ps) , usual status (ps+ss), current weekly status (cws) and current daily status (cds)

3.2.2.1 Usual status approach: During the period January - June 2004, the usual status (ps+ss) LFPRs for persons in the rural areas was nearly 44 per cent - about 7 percentage points higher than that in the urban areas. The differences in the estimates of LFPRs in respect of sex were quite significant. While the corresponding proportions for males were quite close to each other - 55 and 56 per cent for rural and urban males respectively - the proportions for the rural and urban females showed pronounced difference – 32 and 16 per cent, respectively.

3.2.2.2 Current status approach: Compared to estimates of LFPRs based on the current statuses, the usual status (ps+ss) LFPRs were higher in both the sectors and more so for rural females. This could be due to the fact that some of the usually employed withdraw themselves from labour force when there is no work during some periods of the year rather than reporting themselves as unemployed. The difference is found to be more for females in the rural areas where the seasonality in work is known to be predominant.

3.2.2.3 Sex-ratio of labour force: The sex ratio among persons in the labour force (i.e. number of females in the labour force per 1000 males in the labour force), according to usual principal status, obtained from detailed Table 3 given in the Appendix A, reveals that females were far outnumbered by males in the labour force – to a greater extent in urban areas (218) than in rural areas (413). However, when the usual status ‘all workers’ approach is followed, females were relatively more frequent in the labour force. This was more so in rural areas (555) than in urban areas (261) as obtained from appendix Table 4. This reflects that the feature of females being engaged in subsidiary economic activities was more frequently observed in rural areas than in urban areas.

3.2.3 Usually employed

3.2.3.1 Of the three estimates obtained on the basis of three approaches mentioned above, the first one gives the magnitude of the 'usually employed' or the 'usual status work-force'. In Statement 6, estimates have been presented for two categories viz. (a) 'usually employed' or 'working' in the principal status (ps workers) and (b) 'usually employed' or 'working' in the principal and subsidiary statuses taken together (ps+ss workers). The second category constitutes the total usually employed (or 'all' workers). The first category pertains to those with more or less stable employment.

3.2.3.2 Statement 6 presents the WPRs based on three approaches obtained from the present survey. It is seen from the Statement that during January to June, 2004, WPR was about 431 in the rural areas and 354 in the urban, according to the usual status (ps+ss) i.e. by considering principal and subsidiary statuses together. For males, the worker population ratio was 54 per cent in both the rural and urban which was much higher than that for the females. Among 100 females, only 32 in the rural and 15 in the urban areas were found to be working according to the usual status (ps+ss). A further comparison of WPRs according to usual (ps) and usual (ps+ss) gives an idea about the dimension of subsidiary status workers among 'all' workers i.e. workers according to usual (ps+ss). Difference of WPRs according to usual (ps+ss) and usual (ps) gives the dimension of workers who worked in the subsidiary capacity only. It is noteworthy that among 'all' male workers in the rural areas, nearly 3 per cent had worked solely in the subsidiary capacity and the corresponding proportion for urban males was 2 per cent. This proportion increased manifold in the case of 'all' female workers. About 28 per cent of them, in the rural areas, had worked in the subsidiary capacity only and the proportion turned out to be 19 per cent for urban 'all' female workers. Having surplus labour force in the country, the fact reveals, to some extent, the availability of occasional employment during the period of survey.

3.2.4 Estimates of Employed according to Current Status

3.2.4.1 The *usual status* approach adopted for classification of the population is unable to capture the changes in the activity pattern caused by seasonal fluctuations. But the estimates obtained by adopting the current weekly and current daily status approaches are expected to reflect the overall effect caused by the intermittent changes in the activity pattern during the year. The latter reflects also the changes that take place even during a week. The estimates of the *employed* based on *current weekly status* give the average weekly picture while those based on *current daily status* give the average daily picture of employment. The difference between the two rates indicates the *underemployment* of those who had some employment in the week. Statement 6 gives the relevant estimates of the *employed* according to *current weekly status* and *current daily status* for all-India based on the survey.

3.2.4.2 The difference between the WPRs of persons according to usual status (ps+ss) and current weekly status approach is found to be 5 percentage points and a little over 1 percentage point in the rural and urban areas, respectively. The sex-wise difference in the two rates was of the same order in the case of urban areas, but narrowed down, as compared to urban, for rural males (3 percentage points) and widened for rural females (7 percentage points) – revealing the higher incidence of underemployment among the usually employed rural females. The difference between the two rates obtained on the basis of current weekly status approach and current daily status approach, again, shows similar pattern between sexes and sector. It may be

noted that WPR for rural females according to usual (ps+ss) was 315 and that according to current daily status was 190 showing a difference of nearly 13 percentage points. Thus, among all the person days available for usually employed rural females, about 41 per cent were without work. In other words, about 41 per cent of the labour-days remained unutilized in respect of the usually employed rural female.

3.2.5 Changes in WPR over NSS Rounds

3.2.5.1 Statement 7 presents the WPRs obtained from the present survey as well as those from the previous surveys. It may be noted that certain procedural changes were made in the classification of 'employed', 'unemployed' and 'persons out of labour force' in course of the earlier rounds. Prior to NSS 50th round survey (1993-94), a tricotomous classification, based on major time criterion, was adopted in classifying the population into the broad groups: 'employed', 'unemployed' and 'persons out of labour force'. According to the tricotomous classification, persons were directly classified into any of the three categories viz. 'employed' or 'unemployed' or 'out of labour force' based on major time criterion. In the later rounds of surveys, a two-stage dichotomous classification was adopted. In the first stage, a person was considered either belonging to the 'labour force' or 'out of labour force' based on major time criterion and then, in the second stage, the 'persons in the labour force' were classified into 'employed' and 'unemployed' again based on major time criterion. However, in both the approaches, the count of 'employed', 'unemployed' and 'persons out of labour force' are expected to be the same according to the principal and subsidiary statuses taken together.

3.2.5.2 The comparison of WPRs over a short period shows that, compared to the year 2003, the WPRs, according to the principal and subsidiary statuses taken together, did not change much during the first half of 2004 in both the rural and urban areas. However, an increase of 1 percentage point is noted in the WPR for females based on current weekly status – indicating, thereby, the reduction of underemployment to some extent during the period of survey. The behavior of WPRs over a long period since 1983 shows irregular movements within a range of 3 to 4 percentage points.

3.2.6 Age Specific Usual Status Worker Population Ratio (ASWPR)

3.2.6.1 The number of persons employed in a particular age-group per 1000 persons in that age-group is defined as the age specific worker population ratio (ASWPR). Based on the age recorded, the ASWPRs are estimated from the 60th round data for broad age groups for the principal status (ps) workers, 'all' workers, current weekly status workers and current daily status workers. The relevant results, separately for rural and urban areas, are presented for all-India in Statement 8. It is seen that for both males and females and in rural and urban sectors, the ASWPR is found to be the highest in the age group 30-59 years followed by the ASWPR for the youth of 15-29 years. According to usual status (ps+ss), the ASWPR for males in the age group 30-59 years was 97 per cent and 95 per cent in the rural and urban areas, respectively. The corresponding proportions for females in the age group 30-59 years were 58 per cent and 27 per cent in the rural and urban areas, respectively. It is important to note that the incidence of child labour, in spite of a lot of campaign to abolish child labour in the country, is quite significant, particularly in the rural areas. According to usual status, about 4 per cent of male and female children of age 5-14 years in the rural and 3 per cent of male children in the urban were identified to pursue some economic activities to earn their livelihood. The proportion was much lower, around 1 per cent, in the case of urban female children.

3.2.7 Education Level Specific Usual Status WPR

3.2.7.1 Among persons of age 15 years and above, the number of persons who are usually employed in a particular education category per 1000 persons in that education category is defined as the education level specific worker population ratio. Such ratios have been worked out for all persons of age 15 years and above and for the youth, i.e., for persons of age 15-29 years. For working out such education specific worker population ratios, the persons of age 15 years and above are classified into 7 categories viz., 'not literate', 'literate and up to primary', 'middle', 'secondary', 'higher secondary', 'diploma/certificate' and 'graduate and above'. The relevant worker population ratios for rural and urban India for 'all' workers are shown in Statement 9.

3.2.7.2 For persons in the age-groups '15-29 years' and '15 years and above', Statement 9 reveals a common trend in the worker-population ratio (WPR) over the educational levels for all categories of persons classified in terms of sex and sector. The WPR shows a decreasing trend with the increase in the levels of general education of the persons till 'higher secondary' and then, increases gradually for persons with educational level 'diploma/certificate' and 'graduate and above'. For the purpose of the survey, those who obtained some diploma or certificate in any trade after completion of their 'middle school' standard, or after completion of 'secondary' or 'higher secondary' and the 'diploma/certificate' obtained by them in the trade is equivalent to the general educational level 'secondary' or 'higher secondary', were categorized as persons with 'diploma/certificate'. Among them, the WPR is observed to be higher than that for those with educational level 'secondary' or 'higher secondary'. Among the females with 'diploma/certificate', the rate is even higher than that among all the categories of females, except illiterate females of age group 15-29 in the rural areas.

3.2.7.3 General observation is that at all-India level, for rural males of age 15 years and above with educational qualification 'graduate and above' (or rural male graduate, in brief), the worker-population ratio was 836 in a thousand as against 797 for the same group in the urban areas. The corresponding rates among the females were 364 and 307 in a thousand. While these rates reduced by 16 and 21 percentage points for youth males (15-29 years) in the rural and urban areas, respectively, it reduced by about 8 percentage points for youth females both in rural and urban areas.

3.2.8 Distribution of Usually Employed by Status of Employment

3.2.8.1 As stated earlier in Chapter Two, employed persons are categorised into three broad groups according to their status of employment. These broad groups are: (i) *self-employed*, (ii) *regular wage/salaried employees* and (iii) *casual labour*. Statements 10R and 10U show per 1000 distribution of usually employed by these broad groups for all-India rural and urban for both principal status (ps) workers and 'all' workers. The statement also gives the results on the corresponding distribution obtained from the earlier surveys. The discussion below, as before, pertains to 'all' workers.

3.2.8.2 During 2004 (January-June), in rural India, more than half of the usually employed ('all' workers) were *self-employed* – 57 per cent among males and nearly 62 per cent among females. The corresponding proportions in urban India were 44 per cent for males and 45 per cent for females. Proportion of *regular employees* was relatively low among females as compared to males in both rural and urban India. On the other hand, proportion of *casual labour* was more among female workers than that among male workers, particularly in the urban areas.

3.2.8.3 *Change over rounds*: For rural males, the proportion of *self-employed* had gradually fallen from 61 per cent in 1983 to 57 per cent in 2004. On the other hand for females, the proportion declined from 62 per cent in 1983 to 53 per cent in January–June, 1998 and then, gradually climbed to nearly 62 per cent in 2004. Interestingly, there has been a corresponding increase in the proportion of male *casual labour* over this period. During this period, though the proportion of *regular employees* among urban males had fallen by about 3 percentage points; among urban females, there had been an increase in this proportion – by about 8 to 10 percentage points.

3.2.9 Industrial Distribution of Usually Employed

3.2.9.1 As in the earlier employment and unemployment surveys, for the 60th round survey also, information relating to the sector (industry) of employment in which a person was working has been collected for the persons categorised as *employed*. In the case of *usually employed*, this information was collected for both the principal status (ps) as well as subsidiary status (ss) workers. Statement 11 shows the distribution of the *usually employed* by industry, separately for usual ‘principal status’ (ps) workers and for ‘all’ workers. In present survey, the industry classification followed is NIC 1998. Similar results based on the earlier quinquennial surveys are also presented in the Statement. It may be mentioned that NIC 1998 is being used since NSS 55th round survey. Earlier to that, NIC 1970 was used in some rounds and NIC 1987 in some others. For example, in NSS 50th round NIC 1987 was used while in NSS 43rd and 38th rounds NIC 1970 was used. A concordance of activity classification between NIC 1970 and NIC 1987, and between NIC 1987 and NIC 1998 is given below in a tabular form.

It may be noted that the changes in the activity classification across rounds at the broad sectoral level (i.e., primary, secondary and tertiary), based on the results of the earlier surveys on employment and unemployment, are minor in quantitative terms, particularly in the rural areas. While in the urban areas, the share of workforce relating to the industry of activity “tailoring establishments” (activity code 964 as per NIC 1987), as revealed from the earlier surveys, could be in the order of around 2 per cent, the corresponding share of other industry of activities effecting the classification across rounds (specified in the concordance table) was very negligible. This fact may be taken into account in measuring the sectoral changes of workforce over rounds.

3.2.9.2 *Rural areas*: Statement 11 shows that, in the first half of 2004, in rural India, among ‘all’ *usually employed*, about 66 per cent of the males and 84 per cent of the females were engaged in the agricultural sector. Compared to this, the proportion of males engaged in the agricultural activities was 78 per cent in 1983, 75 per cent in 1987-88 (NSS 43rd round), 74 per cent in 1993-94 (NSS 50th round), and 71 per cent in 1999-2000 (NSS 55th round). At those points of time, the proportion of female workers engaged in the agricultural activities were 88, 85, 86 and 85 per cent, respectively – showing an overall declining trend in the share of employment in the agricultural sector (NIC-98 industry division: 01-05). On the contrary, over these years, in rural India, there has been a gradual increase in the proportion of males engaged in ‘secondary’ (NIC-98 industry division: 10-45) and ‘tertiary’ (NIC-98 industry division: 50-99) sector.

3.2.9.3 *Urban areas*: In urban India, the 'tertiary' sector engaged about 59 per cent of the male workers while the 'secondary' sector accounted for about 35 per cent of the usually employed males. For females, the corresponding proportions were lower with 53 and 31 per cent. Proportion of urban females employed in agricultural sector fell by about 15 percentage points since 1983, with a significant rise for other sectors.

3.2.10 Participation in Subsidiary Economic Activities Vs Principal Status

3.2.10.1 In the preceding sub-sections, all discussions on employment pertained to those who were economically active as per their principal or subsidiary usual activity status. In Statement

12, the proportion of persons who reported to pursue some economic activity in the subsidiary capacity is given for each category of persons belonging to a principal activity status. This will provide the proportion of principal status workers with subsidiary work and of those who did not work according to the principal status but worked in the subsidiary capacity only.

3.2.10.2 It is seen from Statement 12 that, during the first half of 2004, about 16 to 18 per cent of persons in the rural and only 4 per cent in the urban areas reported to be pursuing subsidiary economic activity. About 31 to 32 per cent among the principal

status workers, in the rural areas, reported to pursue some economic activity in the subsidiary capacity as well. In the urban areas, the same proportion was only 5 per cent among the principal status workers. Compared to principal status workers, the proportion of persons who reported to have pursued economic activity in the subsidiary capacity was relatively lower among the unemployed in the rural areas, but higher in the urban areas. However, the proportion is found to be the lowest among persons who were out of labour force. It is most important to note that, unlike all other categories, the proportion among the females in the out of labour force category who reported to have pursued economic activity in the subsidiary capacity was higher than that among their male-counterparts.

3.2.11 Daily Wage Rates of Casual Labourers

3.2.11.1 Data on the average wage earnings per day received by casual labourers and regular wage/salaried persons during each of the seven days of the reference week were collected in this survey. It may be noted that regular wage/salaried earners, generally, receive bonus and perquisites such as free accommodation, reimbursement of expenditure for medical treatment, free telephones, etc. and those are evaluated at the cost to the employer or at retail prices and duly apportioned for the reference week and also included in their earnings. In contrast, casual labourers are not entitled to the additional benefits besides wage/salary that are enjoyed by the regular wage/salary workers.

Statement 13 presents the wage rates, at the all-India level, for the casual labourers and Statement 14 for the regular wage employees disaggregated by rural and urban sectors. The male-female and rural-urban disparities in the wage rates are found to be prominent. In the rural sector, on an average, Rs. 56.53 was earned in a day by a male casual labourer whereas a female casual labourer Rs. 36.15 in a day – showing a difference of about Rs. 20. In the urban sector, the wage difference between males and females was even more sharper. The difference was of the order of Rs. 31 or more. In fact, a male casual labourer in the urban areas earned Rs. 75.51 in a day and a female, Rs. 44.28 in a day. The wage rate for the casual labourers, in the urban areas was higher than that in the rural areas.

3.2.11.2 Statement 14 gives the average wage rates for regular wage employees. Here too, the male-female and rural-urban disparities in the wage rates are found sharper than that in the rural areas. The average wage rate for regular wage employees, in the rural areas, was Rs. 141.56 for males and Rs. 91.60 for females – the difference was of the order of nearly Rs. 50. As in the case of casual labourers, the wage rate was higher in the urban areas. The corresponding wage rates in the urban areas were Rs. 195.77 for the males and Rs. 163.13 for the females and thus, a females regular wage earner was paid, on an average, around Rs. 32 less. This difference was, contrary to the situation for casual labourers, lower than that in the rural areas.

3.3 Unemployment

3.3.1 As in the case of employed, for unemployed also, three kinds of estimates are obtained following the three different approaches. These are:

- i) number of persons usually unemployed based on ‘usual status’ approach,
- ii) number of persons unemployed on an average in a week, based on the current ‘weekly status’ approach, and
- iii) number of person-days unemployed on an average during the reference period of seven days preceding the date of survey, based on the current ‘daily status’ approach.

3.3.1.1 Of these three, the first estimate indicates the numerical magnitude of the persons unemployed for a relatively long period during a reference period of 365 days and approximates to an indicator of the chronically unemployed. However, some of the unemployed on the basis of this criterion might be working in a subsidiary capacity. One can, therefore, get another estimate of the unemployed excluding those employed in a subsidiary capacity during the reference period. The former is called the usually unemployed according to the principal status (ps) and the latter, the usually unemployed excluding the subsidiary status workers or us (adjusted), which would conceptually be lower than the former.

3.3.1.2 The second estimate is based on the current weekly status and gives the average weekly picture during the survey year. It includes both chronic unemployment and also the intermittent unemployment of those categorised as usually employed caused by seasonal fluctuations in the labour market.

3.3.1.3 The third estimate based on the current daily status concept considers person-days and gives average level of unemployment on a day during the survey year. It captures three aspects of *unemployment*, viz.:

- (a) the unemployed days of the chronically unemployed,
- (b) the unemployed days of the usually employed who become intermittently unemployed during the reference week and
- (c) the unemployed days of those classified as employed according to the priority criterion of current weekly status approach.

Hence, this estimate may be considered as the most inclusive rate of *unemployment*.

3.3.2 Unemployment rates

3.3.2.1 *Unemployment rate* is defined as the number of persons (person-days in the cds approach) unemployed per thousand persons (person-days in the cds approach) in the *labour force* (which includes both the employed and the unemployed). This, in effect, gives the unutilised portion of the labour force. Thus, it is a more refined indicator of the unemployment situation in a population than the *proportion unemployed*, which is merely the number of the unemployed per thousand persons in the population as a whole. For discussions on the subject of unemployment, the *unemployment rates* are taken up first in this section.

3.3.2.2 Statement 15 presents the unemployment rates (UR) as obtained from the present survey according to the three approaches. The corresponding values of proportion unemployed (PU) in the population are given in parentheses. Some of the important points emerging from this table are:

- (i) the overall unemployment rates are not high for rural areas if the usual status approach is followed;
- (ii) the *usually unemployed* or even more restrictive *us (adjusted)*, measured in terms of usual status, as a proportion of the total population, is fairly small;
- (iii) the urban rates are higher than the rural rates, except for the cds approach;
- (iv) the rates for females are higher than the rates for males in the urban areas, but the rates are roughly equal for rural males and females; and
- (v) the unemployed person-day rates are higher than the rates obtained on the basis of usual status or current weekly status, thereby indicating a high degree of intermittent unemployment. This is mainly due to the absence of regular employment for many workers,

3.3.2.3 *Change in unemployment rate:* Statements 16R and 16U give the unemployment rates obtained from surveys of NSSO conducted since 1993-94 (NSS 50th round). The Statement shows that compared to 1993-94, during 2004 (January-June), the *unemployment rate* in terms of the usual principal status or *us (adj.)*, remained almost the same, except that for females in rural areas. In the urban areas, no significant change in these rates in terms of cws is noticeable between the earlier rounds and the present one. In terms of cds, the rate is found to be higher in 2004 by about 2 percentage points in both the rural and urban areas than that obtained in 1999-2000 (55th round), except for urban males. The difference in the unemployment rate for urban male is found to be about 1 percentage point between these periods. The unemployment rate seems to have increased for all categories, except for urban males, between 2003 and 2004 (January-June), particularly for females.

3.3.3 Unemployment Rates for the Educated and the Youth

3.3.3.1 Unemployment rates among certain specified categories like the educated, the youth, etc. could be higher than the overall rates observed in the previous sub-section. As such, some of these rates, as obtained from the present survey, are looked into in some detail in this sub-section for the *educated* as well as for the *youth*. The rates obtained according to the usual status (ps+ss) have been considered for discussion here.

3.3.3.2 As mentioned earlier, the *educated* are those persons who have attained an educational level of *secondary and above*. Normally, one can attain this educational level at the age of 15 years or above. Thus, the study among the *educated* is restricted to persons of age 15 years and above. In Statement 17, the unemployment rates obtained on the basis of usual status (ps+ss) approach are given for different educational attainments and sex at the all-India level, for persons of age 15 years and above and for the youth. It may be noted that in India, the youth, i.e., persons aged 15-29 years, accounted for 26 to 29 per cent of the total population. (refer Statement 4). A substantial chunk of them attained some level of education and entered the labour market while they were in the age of 15-29 years. In a labour surplus economy like that of India, many of them remained unemployed and continued to search for or be available for employment.

3.3.3.3 The Statement reveals the following interesting observations for the period January-June, 2004:

- (i) In both rural and urban areas, unemployment rate among the *educated* was higher than that among those whose education level was lower than *secondary*.
- (ii) In both rural and urban areas, among the *educated*, the rate was much higher for females than for males. This disparity is even more prominent among the *graduates and above*.
- (iii) The unemployment rate is higher among the youth than among others, except for rural females.
- (iv) The unemployment rate is highest among all categories (i.e., for each sex and sector) of educated youth.
- (v) The unemployment rate is higher among the educated female youths than among the educated male youths.

3.4 Underemployment

3.4.1 Underemployment is commonly defined as the under-utilisation of labour time of the workers. Some of the persons categorised as usually employed, do not have work throughout the year due to seasonality in work or otherwise and their labour time is not fully utilised - they are, therefore, underemployed. Their underemployment is termed as *visible* underemployment if they report themselves to be available for work with respect to a shorter reference period. The NSS measures the *visible* underemployment by cross-classifying persons by (a) their usual and current weekly statuses (b) their usual and current daily statuses and (c) their current weekly and current daily statuses.

3.4.1.1 Some employed persons, particularly the *self-employed*, may appear to work throughout the year. But the work they are pursuing may not fully meet their needs in terms of generating sufficient income, giving a sense of fulfillment to them, etc. They may, therefore, want additional and/or alternative work. Such underemployment is termed as *invisible* underemployment and therefore, not directly measurable. The NSS calculates the indicators of *invisible* underemployment through a set of probing questions addressed to those categorised as usually employed on their availability for additional/alternative work and reason for seeking such additional/alternative work, status of their present engagement (i.e. whether worked more or less regularly), etc. The set of probing questions to try to measure *invisible* underemployment are generally addressed in the quinquennial surveys of NSSO. In this round, being an annual survey on employment and unemployment situation, such information have not been collected. Thus, the discussion in the following paragraphs of this section will relate to the *visible* underemployment.

3.4.2 Underemployment among Usually Employed

3.4.2.1 As mentioned earlier, some persons categorised as usually employed might not have work throughout the year. They might remain without work during some weeks of the year or go without work on some days of the different weeks of the year. The first dimension is brought out by the distribution of the usually employed by their current weekly status. Statement 18 gives the relevant all-India results for persons employed according to usual status (ps+ss) during the first half of the year 2004.

available, a large proportion of females withdrew from the labour force rather than report themselves as unemployed.

3.4.2.2 It is seen from Statement 18 that the proportion of usually employed males who were found to be not employed during the week preceding the date of survey, i.e. the underemployment rate, was 6 per cent in the rural and 3 per cent in the urban areas. Compared to males, the problem of underemployment is more serious among the usually employed females, particularly in the rural areas. Among them, the underemployment rate was as high as 23 per cent in the rural and 10 per cent in the urban areas. Most of the usually employed females who were

3.4.2.3 The activity pattern of the usually employed during different days within the reference week is indicated by the distribution of their days by current daily status. The relevant results for rural and urban India are presented in Statement 19. It is observed that the proportion of person-days of the usually employed utilised for work was quite low for females compared to males. During January-June 2004, this proportion was estimated at about 60 per cent and 78 per cent for females in rural and urban India, respectively as against 87 and 93 per cent for males in rural and urban India, respectively. Once again, it is observed that when work was not

3.4.3 Underemployment of persons categorised as working according to Current Weekly Status

3.4.3.1 As mentioned earlier, some persons classified as working during a week might not have had work for the entire week. The distribution of person-days for persons working according to current weekly status therefore, would indicate the proportion of person-days on which they had remained without work. These results are presented in Statement 20 for rural and urban sectors of all-India, separately for male and female.

3.4.3.2 In January-June 2004, the percentage of person-days on which persons with some work during the reference week (according to current weekly status) were without work was estimated at about 7 for rural males, 23 for rural females, 4 for urban males and 14 for urban females. However, both in rural and urban areas when there was no work, a higher proportion of females as compared to males withdrew from the labour force.

3.5 Unemployed on all seven days of the reference week

3.5.1 This section deals with persons aged 15-59 years who were unemployed on all 7 days of the reference week. In the following paragraphs, different features of such persons, henceforth referred to as 'unemployed' in brief, are discussed. It may be noted in this context that the counts of sample persons who were unemployed on all 7 days of the reference week are not adequate to get a reliable estimates at the State/U.T. level and sometimes even at the all-India level. One may, therefore, use these results and interpret them cautiously. The counts of such sample persons are given at the all India level in Statement 21.

3.5.2 Unemployed who were ever employed

3.5.2.1 For the purpose of survey, among those who were unemployed on all the seven days of the reference week but had more or less regular work at least for some time in the past were considered as *ever employed*. The information on whether an unemployed was *ever employed* or not was collected to differentiate the *ever employed* from the first-time work seekers. The proportion of unemployed who were *ever employed* per 1000 unemployed as estimated from the NSS 60th round survey is given for each broad age-group and separately by educational level with male-female and rural-urban breakdown in Statements 22 and 23, respectively. Obviously, 1000 minus these proportions will be the estimated proportions of new entrants into the labour market among the unemployed.

3.5.2.2 It is seen from Statements 22 and 23 that the proportion of *ever employed*, among those of age 15-59 and unemployed on all the 7 days of the week, increases with age but decreases with the level of education. A reverse relationship will, therefore, hold for the new entrants into the job market. Among the *educated* unemployed (i.e., with educational level secondary and above), in rural areas, 67 per cent among males and 79 per cent among females sought employment for the first time. Among the urban educated

males, the proportion was same as that for the rural males. But, it was 73 per cent among the urban educated females - somewhat lower compared to the rural females. The corresponding proportions among the *not literate* unemployed were 13 per cent (males) and 8 per cent (females) in rural areas and 10 per cent (males) and 13 per cent (females) in urban areas. Among the different age-groups, the proportion of the new entrants was the highest in the age-group 15-29 years and in this age-group, the proportion was the highest among urban females. Overall, the proportion of new entrants among the unemployed was higher in the urban areas than that in the rural areas.

3.5.3.3 Status of last employment: The distribution of the unemployed who had worked for some time in the past by their status in their last employment is shown in Statement 24. Among them, in rural areas, as high as 69 per cent (among males) and 84 per cent (among females) were engaged as *casual labour* in the past, while in urban areas, about 35 and 28 per cent – for males and females respectively – were *casual labour*. A significant proportion of the urban unemployed – 44 per cent for males and 62 per cent for females – who had worked for some time in the past had been *regular wage/salaried* workers. In rural areas, the corresponding proportions were very low – just 8 per cent for males and 9 per cent for females.

3.5.3.4 Sector of last employment: The distribution of the unemployed who were ever employed by industry of last employment is given in Statement 25. In the data set, some not recorded cases have been found for industry of last employment. Those cases have been omitted in obtaining the distribution presented in Statement 25 and therefore, the results presented here may differ marginally with that in the Appendix. When the distribution is examined with respect to that for the usual status workers given in Statement 11 (the figures are given in the parentheses here also), although they show a considerable difference in the two distributions, a consistent pattern is, however, noted in respect of relative importance of various sectors of industry. The comparison of the two distributions is expected to reveal broadly the sectors of activity where the incidence of break in employment was more in the past. In the case of ever employed rural males, for example, the proportion of ever employed in the primary sector was less as compared to

present usual work force: this indicates that the break in employment was less frequent among the rural workers who were engaged in the agricultural sector in the past. Similarly, the incidence of break in employment appeared to be prominent among the urban male workers engaged in the manufacturing sector. The females, particularly those residing in the urban, were vulnerable for break in employment in the tertiary sector in the past but were relatively safe in the manufacturing sector.

3.5.3.5 Reason for becoming unemployed for those who had work in the past: The information on reason for becoming unemployed was collected for those who had been employed in the past. The results are given in Statement 26. Among them, in rural areas, about 54 per cent for

males and 72 per cent for females became unemployed due to *lack of work in the area*. In urban areas, these proportions were 20 per cent and 21 per cent for males and females, respectively. About 4 per cent of the unemployed males and females, in the rural areas, had *quit earlier job*. In the urban, on the other hand, 'quit earlier job' is found to be a significant reason for break in employment – the proportion being 11 per cent for males and 25 per cent for females. *Lay-off, closure of the unit or loss of earlier job* were reported as the reason for unemployment by about 29 per cent of the urban male unemployed and 17 per cent of

urban female unemployed. Among other specified reasons, *lack of work in the enterprise* was reported by a considerable proportion of the unemployed – 16 per cent among males and 5 per cent among females in rural areas and 14 per cent among males and 4 per cent among females in urban areas.

3.6 Formal Vocational Training

3.6.1 For the purpose of this survey, a vocational training was broadly defined as a training which prepared an individual for a specific vocation or occupation. The main objective of vocational education and training is to prepare persons, especially the youth, for the world of work and make them employable for a broad range of occupations in various industries and other economic sectors. It aims at imparting training to persons in very specific fields through providing significant 'hands on' experience in acquiring necessary skill, which make them employable or create for them opportunities of self-employment.

3.6.1.1 In the survey, information was collected only on formal vocational training and for persons of age 15-29 years and educational level 'middle school and above but below graduate' and for persons of age 15-29 years and educational level 'graduate in vocational training'. The vocational training that took place in specialised education and training institutions, which followed a structured training programme, leading to recognised certificates, diplomas or degrees was considered as formal vocational training. It may be observed from Table 7 of the Appendix that the first group of persons (age 15-29 years and educational level 'middle school and above but below graduate') constituted about 12 per cent of total population in the rural and 17 per cent of total population in the urban areas. The second group formed only 0.73 per cent and 3.36 per cent of total population in the rural and urban areas, respectively. Moreover, the count of sample persons of age 15-29 years and educational level 'graduate in vocational training' was only 28, 9, 40 and 38, at the all-India level, for rural males, rural females, urban males and urban females, respectively. Therefore, in the following sub-sections, the discussion relating to formal vocational training will be confined to the first group, i.e., for persons of age 15-29 years and educational level 'middle school and above but below graduate'.

3.6.2 Persons with Vocational Training

3.6.2.1 Statement 27 presents the estimates of the proportion of persons who received formal vocational training separately for each sex, quinquennial age-group and sector at the all-India level. Nearly 3 per cent of persons in the rural and 6 per cent in the urban reported to have received formal vocational training. The proportion seems to be smaller in the case of females than of males, particularly in the urban areas. Moreover, as expected, the proportion increases with age of persons. In fact, the proportion of persons moved upward from 1 per cent for the age-group 15-19 years to 3.5 per cent for the age-group 20-24 years and then, to 4 per cent for the age-group 25-29 years in the rural areas.

The corresponding movement of the said proportion over these age-groups, in the urban areas, had been from 2.4 per cent to 8.1 per cent and then, to 8.6 per cent.

3.6.3 Vocational Training and General Level of Education

3.6.3.1 The proportion of persons who received formal vocational training by general level of education is given in Statement 28 separately for each sex, age-group and sector at the all-India level. The proportion increases with level of education and is found to be highest among those whose level of general educational was 'diploma/certificate course'. In the rural areas, about 62 per cent of males and 50 per cent of females whose level of general education was 'diploma/certificate course', reported to have received some kind of vocational training. The urban proportion has been 63 per cent and 44 per cent for males and females, respectively. In

comparison, the proportion among persons whose level of general educational was 'middle school', was less than even 1 per cent in the rural areas and 1 to 2 per cent in the urban areas.

3.6.4 Vocational Training and Broad Activity Status

3.6.4.1 The proportion of persons who received formal vocational training by broad activity status is given in Statement 29 separately for each sex and sector at the all-India level. It is most interesting to note that the proportion is found to be highest among the unemployed youths and that too, among the females, although they reported to have some kind of formal vocational training. Among the unemployed female youths, the proportion was as high as 17 per cent in the rural areas and 24 per cent in the urban areas, whereas it was, among the unemployed male youths, 10 % and 17 % in the rural and urban areas, respectively.

3.6.5 Field of Vocational Training

3.6.5.1 Field of training signifies the specific areas of the training that a person has obtained in the past and relates broadly to the specific trade. In the survey, information in respect of 21 field of specific areas of trade was collected and have been presented in Statement 30 in the form of distribution of the trainings received by the persons. If a person has received training in two different fields then it has been counted as two trainings in obtaining the distribution in Statement 30 as well as in Statements 31, 32 and 33 presented subsequently.

3.6.5.2 Statement 30 shows that for males, the most demanded field of training is found to be 'electrical and electronic engineering trades (code 02)' (27 per cent) followed by 'mechanical engineering trades (code 01)' (24 per cent) and 'computer trades (code 03)' (13 per cent) in the rural areas; and 'computer trades' (32 per cent) followed by 'electrical and electronic engineering trades' (23 per cent) and 'mechanical engineering trades' (17 per cent) in the urban areas. Among female youths, the pattern of demand is a little different. About 38 per cent of them in the rural areas, highest among all fields, had formal vocational training in the field of

‘textile related work (code 07)’. This was followed by the trades ‘computer’ (17 per cent) and ‘health and paramedical services related work (code 13)’ (13 per cent). Among the urban female youths, the choices in terms of the relative shares were ‘computer trades’ (33 per cent), ‘textile related work’ (24 per cent) and ‘health and paramedical services related work’ (10 per cent).

3.6.6 Institution of Vocational Training

3.6.6.1 Conventionally, vocational education and training has been oriented towards a number of engineering and technical trades. Though they continue to form the core of vocational education, its scope was considerably widened to include many non-engineering trades also. Information on some of the major sources from where vocational training can be received have been collected in the survey and the distribution of training institutions has been presented in Statement 31 separately for each sex and sector at the all-India level. The Statement reveals the obvious fact that *field of training* has got relation with the *institution of training*. The Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) and Industrial Training Centres (ITCs), Schools offering vocational courses and Polytechnics together played the major role in providing training to the youths and males in particular. The other institutes like Tailoring, Embroidery and Stitch Craft Institutes, and Polytechnics also contributed significantly in imparting training to the female youths in the country.

3.6.7 Usefulness of Vocational Training

3.6.7.1 To collect information on usefulness/ helpfulness of the training received, two probing questions were asked to the informant – one on the *usefulness* of the training in the present economic activity and another on the *helpfulness* of the training in taking up an/another economic activity. Information on the usefulness of the training received in the present economic activity was collected for all the members (age 15-29 years and educational level ‘middle school and above but below graduate’) of the household who were already employed. On the other hand, information on the helpfulness or prospect of the training received in taking up an/another economic activity was collected for the members (of age 15-29 years and educational level ‘middle school and above but below graduate’) of the household irrespective of their activity status.

3.6.7.2 In this context of studying usefulness and helpfulness of the training received by the individual, three Statements (Statements 32, 33 and 34) have been presented here. Statement 32 gives the number of sample persons (age 15-29 years and educational level ‘middle school and above but below graduate’) who received formal vocational training, netted in the survey by sex, sector and field of training at the all-India level. The estimated proportion of persons who reported that the training could be helpful in taking up an/another economic activity is presented in Statement 33 along with the respective sample counts. Statement 34, which is similar to Statement 33, presents the proportion of persons who were employed and reported that the training was useful in taking up economic activity along with the respective sample counts. These three Statements should be examined side by side to understand the magnitude of proportions in various categories (sex X sector X field of training) and their reliability in terms of sample size. It is found that the sample size for many of the categories are so small that the estimates given in Statements 33 and 34 may be far from the true values owing to large sampling errors. The observations obtained from this survey suggest that a separate sampling design may be thought of for capturing a sample of adequate size, preferably through a separate survey, in order to carry out an in-depth study on vocational training on the lines of NSS 60th round survey.

Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

1 Subject Coverage: The 60th round (January-June 2004) of NSSO covered surveys on 'consumer expenditure', 'employment-unemployment' and 'morbidity and health care'. A separate schedule on employment and unemployment was canvassed in the 60th round. This was for the first time in an annual round of NSSO. During this round, the following schedules of enquiry were canvassed:

Schedule 0.0	: list of households
Schedule 1.0	: consumer expenditure
Schedule 10	: employment and unemployment
Schedule 25.0	: morbidity and health care

2 Geographical coverage: The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union *except* (i) Leh (Ladakh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, (ii) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond five kilometres of the bus route and (iii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year.

3 Period of survey and work programme: The period of survey was of six months duration from 1st January 2004 to 30th June 2004. The survey period of this round was divided into two sub-rounds of three months duration each as follows:

sub-round 1	: January - March 2004
sub-round 2	: April - June 2004

In each of these two sub-rounds equal number of sample villages/blocks (FSUs) was allotted for survey with a view to ensuring uniform spread of sample FSUs over the entire survey period.

4 Sample Design

4.1 A stratified multi-stage sampling design, for rural as well as urban areas, was adopted for selection of the sample units in the 60th round survey of NSSO. The first stage units (FSU) were the census villages (panchayat wards for Kerala) in the rural areas and the Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks of NSSO in the urban areas. The ultimate stage units (USU) were households in both rural and urban areas. In case of large villages/blocks, hamlet-groups/sub-blocks constituted the intermediate stage whenever these were formed in the selected FSU.

4.2 *Selection of the first-stage units (FSU's):* The various steps involved for selection of the FSUs are discussed at length in the following few paragraphs.

4.2.1 *Sampling frame for first stage units:* For rural areas, the list of villages as per Population Census 1991 (panchayat wards for Kerala and Census 1981 villages for J & K) constituted the sampling frame for selection of sample FSUs. For Nagaland, the list of villages located within 5 kilometers of a bus route constituted the sampling frame, whereas,

the list of accessible villages constituted the sampling frame for Andaman & Nicobar Islands. For the urban areas, the list of latest available Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks of NSSO was used as the sampling frame for selection of FSUs. The Leh (Ladkh) and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir were kept outside the survey coverage.

4.2.2 Stratification of first-stage units in rural areas: For formation of strata in the rural areas, village population as per census 1991 was considered. From the list of villages of each State/ Union Territory (U.T.), initially, two *special strata* were formed at the State/ UT level as stated below:

Stratum 1: all FSUs with population between 0 to 50 and

Stratum 2: FSUs with population more than 15,000.

In a state/U.T, special stratum 1 was formed whenever at least 50 such FSUs were found in a State/UT and special stratum 2 was formed if at least 4 such FSUs were found in a State/UT. Otherwise, such FSUs were merged with the general strata.

From FSUs other than those covered under special strata 1 & 2, general strata were formed and its numbering started from 3. Each district of a State/UT was normally treated as a separate stratum. However, if the census rural population of the district was greater than or equal to 2 million as per population census 1991 or 2.5 million as per population census 2001, the district was split into two or more strata by grouping contiguous tehsils. However, in Gujarat, some districts were not wholly included in an NSS region. In such cases, the part of the district falling in an NSS region constituted a separate stratum.

4.2.3 Stratification of first-stage units in urban areas: In the urban sector, strata were formed within each NSS region on the basis of size class of towns as per Population Census 2001. The stratum numbers and their composition (within each region) were as follows:

stratum number	size class of town
1	all towns with population less than 50,000
2	all towns with population 50,000 or more but less than 2 lakhs
3	all towns with population 2 lakhs or more but less than 10 lakhs
4, 5, 6,...	each town with population 10 lakhs or more

The stratum numbers were kept as above even if, in some regions, some of the strata were not formed.

4.2.4 Allocation of first-stage units among Strata: A total of 7612 FSUs (4908 villages and 2704 UFS blocks) were allocated at the all-India level on the basis of Investigator strength in different States/UTs. The total number of sample FSUs was allocated to the different States and U.T.s in proportion to provisional population as per Census 2001 subject to the availability of Investigator, ensuring more or less uniform workload. The State/ U.T. level sample FSUs was then allocated between the rural and urban sectors in proportion to provisional population as per Census 2001 with 1.5 weightage to urban areas subject to the restriction that urban sample size for bigger states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, etc. did not exceed the rural sample size. A minimum of 8 FSUs was allocated to each state/UT separately

for rural and urban areas. The FSUs allocated for rural and urban areas of each State/ U.T. are available in Table A at the end of this Chapter.

Within each sector of a State/ U.T., the respective sample size was allocated to the different strata in proportion to the provisional population of the stratum as per Census 2001. Allocations at stratum level were adjusted to a multiple of 4 with a minimum sample size of 4.

4.2.5 Selection of first stage units: FSUs were selected with Probability Proportional to Size with replacement (PPSWR), size being the population as per Population Census 1991 in all the strata for rural sector except for stratum 1. In stratum 1 of rural sector and in all the strata of urban sector, selection was done using Simple Random Sampling without replacement (SRSWOR). Within each stratum, samples were drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples in both rural and urban sectors.

4.3 Selection of ultimate stage units (USUs) within a FSU: The various steps involved for selection of the USUs i.e households within a FSU are discussed below.

4.3.1 Selection of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks: Large villages and blocks having approximate present population 1200 or more were divided into a suitable number of 'hamlet-groups' in the rural sector and 'sub-blocks' in the urban sector, as given below:

Hamlet-groups / sub-blocks were formed by more or less equalising the population. Two hamlet-groups / sub-blocks were selected from a large village or UFS block, wherever hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were formed, by SRSWOR. Listing and selection of the households were done independently in the two selected hamlet-groups/sub-blocks so formed.

4.3.2 Stratification of households for Schedule 10: For both rural and urban sector, all the households listed in a village/ UFS block in case there was no hamlet group/ sub-block formation and all the households listed in a hamlet group/ sub-block in case of hamlet group/ sub-block formation, were stratified into two second stage strata (SSS). Composition of households for the two second stage strata were as follows:

sss number	composition of households
1	households with at least one member of age below 30 years with educational level secondary or above
2	other households

4.3.3 Selection of households: From each sample village/ block, 8 households were selected for canvassing Schedule 10. Four households were selected from each SSS in case there was no hamlet group/ sub-block formation. In case of hamlet group/ sub-block formation, two households were selected from each SSS within each hamlet group/ sub-block. The sample households from each SSS were selected by Simple Random Sampling Without Replacement (SRSWOR). If a household was selected for more than one schedule, only one schedule was canvassed in that household in the priority order of Schedule 1.0, Schedule 10 and Schedule 25.0 and in that case the household was replaced by another household for canvassing the other schedule.

4.4 FSU and USUs allocated and surveyed: A total of 7612 FSUs (4908 villages and 2704 UFS blocks) were allocated at the all-India level, out of which 6552 villages and 3757 blocks were surveyed. The survey covered 143284 households - 91191 in rural sector and 52093 in urban sector. The number of villages/blocks and households surveyed, for different state/u.t.'s and all-India, are given in Table A at the end of this chapter.
